**Class Participation (5%)** Class Participation is required for this course. Students will receive a starting grade of 100 for attending and participating in class for each unit. Participation is also given for participating in classroom activities and instruction. If you are caught texting, doing work for another class, sleeping, or otherwise off task, points will be deducted from your class participation grade.

**Homework (10%)** Homework assignments will be assigned regularly. This is includes both procedural and application activities.

**Classwork, Quizzes and Bell Work (35%)** Bell work should be completed and stamped within the first FIVE minutes of class. All Classwork must be completed and submitted before the end of class. Classwork assignments will regularly be assigned in Delta Math (teacher code 507918). Please be advised you are required to complete the assignment at deltamath.com

Students will take regular assessments to gauge mastery. Tests will be completed on the appropriate platform and shown work must be submitted. Failure to upload work will result in a zero. In addition, regular notebook checks will be taken as assessment grades.

# **Integrated Technology**

Memphis-Shelby County Schools is adopting a Blended Learning model that combines online educational opportunities for interaction with traditional teaching. Students will rotate through stations and are given some element of control over time, place, method and/or pace. We will primarily use the following stations:

- **Teacher Led (Monday/Tuesday)** In this station, students will receive direct instruction to gain a clear understanding of the material. The teacher will utilize a gradual release of responsibility as students take notes. Students will be able to interact with the teacher and ask clarifying questions.
- Technology Infused (Wednesday)
  - **Guided Notes-** In this station, students will receive direct instruction by utilizing online educational resources and videos.
  - **Reinforcement** In this station, students will use online platforms such as Delta Math and Desmos to master standards flexibly through drill and practice, lab activities and investigations.
- **Small Group-Pairs (Thursday)** In this station, students will collaborate to solve complex tasks, tiered problems or enrichment activities.

• Individual Assessment (Friday)- In these stations, students will work individually on assessments, interventions, enrichment activities or make up work.

## **Make-Up Policy**

Students are expected to begin make up work immediately upon returning to school. For unexcused absences, one day will be given before assignments are considered late. For excused absences, students will have one day for each day excused to turn in work before it is considered late. When assignments are missed, a grade of zero will be entered until the work has been made up. All guided notes, bell work and worksheets are available on TEAMS and my website. Practice assignments and assessments are available at deltamath.com.

## Late Work Policy

Late work will be accepted with a penalty of 25% when turned in late within one week, 50% when turned in late within two weeks with a maximum reduction of 75% thereafter.
